

COMMITTEE REPORTS**ANNUAL MEETING PLANNING COMMITTEE****“Gospel and Empire: What about us?”**

This year’s theme is an invitation to continue to think about how we are called to be the church in the midst of ‘Empire’. As we began planning for this annual meeting, we decided to stay with last year’s theme and to try to address how it is we confront Empire in our own context here in the Maritime Conference.

In the midst of our planning, we had a request from one of our presbyteries to take a ‘balanced approach’ to our consideration of Empire. That request reminds me of the Gospel’s warning about judgment and how we can fail to measure up to the same standards we set for others; how Jesus said it is something of a joke to attempt to take the speck out of another’s eye when we are blind to our own failings - and it *is* difficult to see our own blind spots. Empire, like sin and evil, is not something entirely apart from the church and outside of ourselves that we can stand back from and critique. The sought after ‘balance’, it seems to me, comes in that recognition and we hope the wording of the theme responds to that concern for balance.

That is not to say that the Gospel is any less in opposition to Empire.

Very early in the planning process, we were reminded that this is a General Council year and that there would inevitably be many proposals to come before us because of that. We knew that dealing with them would be time consuming, so setting aside large blocks of time for a theme speaker would not be an option. We have, therefore, invited conference committees to reflect on how their work responds to empire as they present reports and proposals.

The proposals that are before us, and how we deal with them, will say a lot about the issues that occupy us and how we witness to the Gospel. Please read the proposals you will find in the following pages and think about your response to them. Then, as we do the business of the Conference, we will all be working on the theme. From time to time during our annual meeting one of our committee members, Russ Daye, will do some reflection on how we are doing.

We hope that this process will help us all to see, just a little more clearly, what it means to be the church in our time.

CHRISTIAN LIFE & GROWTH COMMITTEE

The Christian Life and Growth Committee (CLG) is called, “with God’s leading, to support creatively the communities of Maritime Conference by discerning gifts, nurturing leadership, developing strategies for transformation through education, worship and communication.” Our ministry is to encourage the faith formation and development of all ages through a variety of initiatives, programs, and communication tools. The following highlights the on-going work of the units within CLG:

The Outdoor Recreational Ministry (ORM) unit continues to focus its energies on supporting UCC camping within the Conference, primarily by organizing the annual CampSTUFF weekend for staff and Boards, and by providing an appropriate faith formation curriculum for the summer camps.

The Computer Use and Education (CUE) unit is on board to provide AV support in the Court of the Annual Meeting. Unfortunately, CUE’s computer use workshops fell victim to bad weather this past winter.

The Children, Youth, and Young Adult (CYaYA) unit is in the process of restructuring so that it may better respond to the Children’s Ministry Future Directions report which was presented late last spring. The reformulated unit will begin work soon.

Intermediates at Conference (IAC) has been added recently as a fourth unit of CLG, in recognition of the growing scope and success of that program.

Although not a unit, the AVEL library falls under the CLG umbrella. See the AVEL Report for specifics.

Beyond the work of its individual units, CLG has been involved in several significant initiatives:

- The BREAKAWAY weekend events generated considerable buzz around the connection between organized sports and faith formation. See www.breakawayweekend.ca for resources and program ideas.
- A number of workshops featuring Godly Play[®] have been presented throughout the Conference. We anticipate that Godly Play[®] will become a popular tool in the faith formation of all ages. Some Godly Play[®] materials are available through AVEL.
- ORM co-Chair Matt Fillier attended CANlead Forum – an international, ecumenical gathering of youth leaders. Matt’s impressions and insights from CANlead will help inform CLG’s future ministry with youth.
- CLG has been granted the privilege of planning for the facilitation of the 2010 Annual Meeting of Conference. Stay tuned!

As with any committee, members of CLG come and go as their terms expire, and over the years CLG’s ministry within the Conference has been blessed and strengthened by the contributions of many gifted people. This year, however, CLG experienced a “going” of a different kind with the death of Lloyd Burrows. We will miss Lloyd’s passion for education as we continue to address the faith formation needs of Maritime Conference.

CHURCH IN ACTION COMMITTEE

As you may know, the work of the Church in Action Committee is parceled out to sub groups. There are two meetings of the whole committee each year as well as an executive to handle emergent issues. This year has been one of transition, as I am new to the chair and Gayle MacDonald is new to the position of secretary.

Over the last year we have worked at consolidating the work of the committee and begun long range evaluation and planning. This is an ongoing process.

Below are the nuts and bolts of the work of our active groups, as submitted by the group chairs:

Children and Youth in Crisis Working Group – Delores Feltmate

The working group has been meeting with Children's Aid offices, making contact with politicians and civil servants, and accumulating extensive research around the issues facing children in care. We have developed worship and study resources for each congregation in the Maritime Conference and we are forwarding a proposal to General Council to declare November 15, 2009 Children in Care Sunday so that these issues will begin to be examined at a national level.

Aboriginal Working Group – Russell Daye

Shortly after last year's AGM, representatives of the AWG, including Chief Hugh Akagi, met with the CiA committee of St. Croix Presbytery to work on recognition of the Passamaquoddy nation, with a first step being an encounter between members of the presbytery and members of the Passamaquoddy first nation. This meeting was held a few weeks later with much hopeful response.

Since then, the major piece of work for the AWG has been preparation for a Right Relations event at Tatamagouche this coming July. A number of the members of the AWG were able to travel to Pinawa, Manitoba in May of 2008 for the national Living into Right Relations event, which brought together 50 aboriginal and 50 non-aboriginal people from all regions of Canada to work on what it means to live in right relations. One of the outcomes of that event was that representatives of Maritime Conference and Newfoundland and Labrador Conference decided to hold a similar event in Atlantic Canada the following summer. The AWG, with a representative from N & L, and with financial support from the national church, has been working on this event, trying to shape it to fit the unique challenges of right relations in our part of the country.

The AWG, through its members, also stayed connected to the Peace and Friendship project of Tatamagouche Centre, and worked with our moderator on the presentation of the UCC's apology for residential schools to local first nations. At present, we are also in discussion with representatives of other denominations about the possibility of bringing the leader's tour for the Truth and Reconciliation Commission to the Maritimes.

Mining Working Group – Kathryn Anderson

The highlight of the our working group's work in 2008-09 was, without a doubt, the highly successful Mining the Connections Forum, which focused on human rights, environmental and economic issues at stake in mining, both in the Maritimes and globally. Over 80 people attended from different churches; principally from the Roman Catholic and United, universities (faculty and students), unions, environmental organizations and community groups. Participants expressed deep appreciation for the United Church's willingness to offer this opportunity for ethical reflection. We are now working to develop United Church support for the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace campaign to establish legal mechanisms that hold Canadian companies working abroad accountable for negative environmental and social impacts of their operations. We also continue to work on the need for a ban on uranium mining in the Maritimes.

Refugee Working Group – Bev McDonald

The major concerns of the Refugee Working Group are; rebuilding the Working Group itself. We need wider representation on the working group so the interests of all three Maritime Provinces are represented; continuing to follow the recent sanctuary case in Halifax of the young Albanian man who is presently in a third safe country; and the resettlement of Palestinian refugees from the El Hol Refugee Camp in northern Syria. These displaced persons have lived most recently in Iraq and were protected by Saddam Hussein but were persecuted after the fall of Iraq. They are coming to Canada as VOR (Visa Office Referred) cases and as such will be privately sponsored.

Environmental Working Group – Linda Scherzinger

Our group began a program to encourage churches to create "Practical Hope" in this time of Climate Change Crisis by raising awareness of environmental problems and solutions, taking action, and working with others. We also sent information and resources to all Pastoral Charges in the Conference to invite them to participate in this program for Practical Hope - including identifying a "Green Enthusiast" / contact person for each congregation to receive and share information/resources and encourage congregational responses. At this point in time there are over 100 Green Enthusiasts in the Conference-wide network. We sponsored workshops for Green Enthusiasts in Truro and Baddeck, NS, and Charlottetown, PEI, in Fall 2008, and in Halifax, NS, Spring 2009. Then we initiated a Practical Hope newsletter which has been sent to Green Enthusiasts. Resources initially sent to churches and/or to Green Enthusiasts are now available to be seen, downloaded and used from the Maritime Conference website (by clicking Committees, CiA, Environmental).

GIFTS AND GIVING COMMITTEE

Gifts and Giving 2008-2009

The main focus of our committee's work is the promotion of the good work of the Mission and Service Fund. In 2008 General Council challenged us to raise \$31,500,000.00 and we raised \$29,715,106.00. In Maritime Conference we raised \$3,309,218.00, a slight increase of our objective of \$3,300,000.00 – congratulations and thank you for your ongoing support. However it was less than 2007 contribution of \$3,422,869.00.

Michael Ball has created a data base to enable the tracking of contributions to the M&S Fund. We are able to track by congregation and presbytery, but more importantly by dates - we can provide a history of giving. It enabled us to write individual thank you letters to every pastoral charge.

In the fall we hired **George Doughart** for a part-time contract position. The purpose is to enhance and expand Stewardship programs and involvement with Mission and Service Fund by congregations within Maritime Conference of The United Church of Canada. Specifically to promote understanding of the theological basis for stewardship and help develop effective Stewardship Committees in all Presbyteries of the Conference. Many of you may have met George on his travels and we hope to continue this effort into 2010.

In all congregations individuals contribute every week to the Mission and Service Fund for the purpose of enabling ministry to happen here at home and around the world. It is important to our partners that your donations are received, on a monthly basis, so that all projects and expenses can be met. To this end we encourage all congregations to appoint a **contact person** to promote the Mission and Service Fund and provide Maritime Conference with their contact information.

We are very pleased to submit stories from our congregations to the **Minute for Mission** book – to share our stories. Please encourage your congregation to read the Minute for Mission every week and submit any stories and photographs to the National church.

Throughout Maritime Conference '**story telling shawls**' are being sewn by those gifted folks who received their patterns last year. Beautifully made from our abundance they enhance our time together as we learn about the many programs and projects funded by the Mission and Service Fund.

In April 2008 a ten member delegation, representing eight presbyteries, traveled to China to join our partner The Amity Foundation. We traveled to several projects funded in part by the Mission and Service Fund. Upon their return, delegates have offered several presentations resulting in a greater understanding of the importance of international partnerships.

We continue to promote the 5-week program 'Celebrate Stewardship' by offering support to congregations. This program has greatly improved the financial status of several

congregations and when completed some have reported up to 40% increase in annual givings. We have assisted with guest speakers for the Celebration Sunday and provided information on PAR (pre-authorized remittances).

In 2007 General Council launched the United for Peace campaign in an effort to raise awareness and money to support peace projects. We established the 'United for Peace blog' on the United Church web site and submitted pictures and write-ups on projects. We encouraged congregations and promoted the resource materials. We have entered the campaigns final stages and are collecting signatures to forward to the Government of Canada.

On June 10th, 2010 we will celebrate the 85th anniversary of The United Church of Canada. We challenge all congregations to begin planning for creative events to mark this occasion and increase awareness of the Mission and Service Fund. A cake, a commitment of \$0.85 per week for every member, 85 special prayers, a recognition for all those over the age of 85; just to name a few.

GOSPEL, ECUMENISM AND THEOLOGY COMMITTEE

The Committee has struggled with weather this year in trying to hold its meetings. In that I am sure we are not alone! As a result, much of our work has been done by conference call.

A significant focus of our work has been in response to the General Council document "Meaning of Ministry," and in response to a referral from the Conference Executive regarding elements of the Celebration of Ministries service. We remain concerned about the lack of clarity and understanding within the church about the different forms of ministry in our midst. We are endeavouring to clarify what ecumenical understandings, if any, exist around Designated Lay Ministry. In response to the Executive referral we strongly recommended that more care be taken within the Celebration of Ministries service to both distinguish the acts of ordination, commissioning and recognition and to educate the Conference as to the differences in those forms.

Ministries in French within the Maritime Conference continues to receive considerable attention from our Committee members. Given limited resources we feel our most effective response is to try and link congregations and individuals interested in this ministry to one another and to the national working unit for ministries in French (UMiF). We recognize the impact that worship in one's mother tongue has for individuals and that, with appropriate leadership, a core of our Anglophone constituency would be supportive in the extension of these services. The challenge remains: finding bilingual worship and pastoral leaders in an area where there is a sufficient Francophone population to support such a ministry. We have created a sub-committee of GET to move forward in this work.

Ecumenism continues as an important focus of the Committee and we are heartened by a growing number of opportunities to participate in regional gatherings of other denominations. The support, inspiration and prayer is very much a two-way street with the Anglican Dioceses of Fredericton and of Nova Scotia and PEI, the Atlantic Canadian Baptist Convention, the Eastern Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, the Presbyterian Synod, the Maine Conference of the United Church of Christ and the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Nova Scotia. There will be representatives from several of these denominations at the Annual Meeting and we encourage you to drop by and extend your personal welcome.

The GET Committee is generally supportive of (if somewhat intimidated by) the proposal to lodge the new rural ministry emphasis with us for the next three years. While we recognize and fully support the significance of this undertaking, the Conference needs to understand that this will require not only finances but also new people with different expertise and skill sets in order to be successful.

We want to draw to the attention of the Conference the General Council office document, "Called to Be Church," and the two companion pieces that are slated to follow. We encourage every congregation and pastoral charge to engage in the discussion of the purpose and mission of our United Church in the brave new landscape where we are

called to be Christ's people. As we follow that calling, Maritime Conference is blessed with a wide range of gifts: languages, traditions, perspectives, passions. They animate our life and empower our work and witness. We encourage the Conference to explore the many possibilities for living out the Gospel's call in our congregations and in our communities. In these challenging times there are many who are seeking a word of hope and a community of nurture and solidarity. May we continue the experience Christ's guidance and blessing as we seek to forge communities of justice and love.

The **Ministry of Memory** is far more than the secure and mandated collection of our church records. It is our story. The story of our congregations, Presbyteries and our Conference as we journey together in faith. We continue to encourage all our Pastoral Charges to send in your records for safekeeping and the care that only our archivist can offer.

Yes, the issue of adequate storage continues to be a concern. The Archives Planning Group will be providing leadership to Conference in the ongoing review and planning of future archives space for Maritime Conference. Their commitment to undertake this task deserves the support and thanks of us all.
