

Intermediates at Conference - Facilitators Needed!

What is Intermediates at Conference (IAC)?

IAC is a 3-day residential event for United Church youth between the ages of 12-15 (or grades 7-9). It is designed to offer participants opportunities to explore the church and youth issues through games, music, worship and discussion.



What does a facilitator do?

As a facilitator, you will be part of the team offering the IAC program. This year, our team includes facilitators, facilitator coordinator, 2 chaplains, the registrar, and the programme director. You will be assigned to a home group of 6-8 participants and will participate in all the IAC events. You will lead activities and discussions with your home group and through these activities foster a sense of community. The IAC planning team has put together a schedule of events that includes games, activities with Youth Forum, participation in portions of the Annual General Meeting of the Maritime Conference, and worship, to name a few.

When do I come to Conference?

Although participants will be arriving on May 27th 2010, you will arrive on **May 26th** for orientation and team building. This is an opportunity to get to know one another, to tour the campus, to get familiarized with the programme, and to do some team building.

Where will I stay?

You will stay in a single room in the same residence as your home group.

Will this cost anything?

Your room and board will be covered from the day of your arrival to departure.

As you will be working with youth, the United Church of Canada requires that you produce a current police records check (PRC) and send us the names and contact information for two references. If you are accepted as a facilitator, we will provide you with a letter to take to your local police department requesting the PRC.
